Milal Missionary Choir Concert at USAG Wiesbaden

In the evening of 24 January, 2015, over 400 persons, many of whom were host nation guests, gathered at historic Hainerberg Chapel, Wiesbaden to hear the Milal Missionary Choir. Milal is an organization established in 1987 by Christian musicians. Their concerts are world class events, but admission is free. The Milal Choir has performed for the last 13 years at Carnegie Hall and the last six years at Wiesbaden. The choir visits nursing homes, orphanages and other venues where people need a message of hope and deliverance. Milal performed under the direction of So Young Park who is the spouse of Major Edward Kim, of the Corps of Engineers. The program varied from Classical to Jazz inspired and had two notable firsts for Milal concerts: first percussion solo on Marimba by Seon Yeong Kang and the first Children's Milal performance. This event was a great celebration for the chapel community and a welcome addition to the Garrison Commanders' Religious Plan for support to Army Families.
